LOOKING BACK: WHAT A YEAR IT WAS!

The 2022-23 fiscal year was a year of transition as both Friends of Drake Well and Drake Well Museum welcomed changes in staffing and experienced an overall change in atmosphere from the past three years as visitation numbers at Drake Well climbed back to where they were prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Friends of Drake Well hired a new Executive Director, Emily Weaver, in February 2023 following the departure of the previous two directors, Erin Wanninger and Arlene Rodriguez, at the end of 2022. Emily hit the ground running and has been going full speed ever since, learning the ins and outs of the site and the FDW organization. The Site Administrator for Drake Well Museum, Michael Knecht, was able to begin working on-site full time in April 2023 after the PHMC filled his former position at Old Economy Village. Other staffing changes for both FDW and PHMC throughout the past year led to the site being short-staffed for much of spring 2023 and lasting into the summer season. Despite this challenge, Drake Well was able to pull through and is now close to being fully staffed again - we have no where to go but up!

It was great to see pre-Pandemic visitation numbers start to return this past year, and it promises to only get better as we move further away from the Pandemic. We were able to hold many of our events and programs again without restrictions, and a sense of "normalcy" has returned to Drake Well after the tumultuous pandemic years.

Our goals for the current 2023-24 FY and beyond are to continue the increase in visitation not only at Drake Well but also Historic Pithole City, to enhance our events and programming at both sites, revamp our outreach efforts, and to continue improving the interpretation of the sites and their stories through updated signage and exhibits.

Another year comes to a close at Drake Well Museum, but stay tuned - this coming year promises to be one of our best yet!







OUR TEAM

We had quite a few staff changes during FY 2022-23! By the end of 2022, Friends of Drake Well saw the departure of two Executive Directors, Erin Wanninger and Arlene Rodriguez, as well as the retirement of the Drake Well Replica Operator Bill Stumpf. David Mock, Gene Hale, and John Hetrick were trained by Bill during the summer of 2022 and came back again for the 2023 season. Emily Weaver started as the new Executive Director in February 2023. FDW also hired Vicki Gilson in June 2023 as the part-time seasonal Coordinator for Historic Pithole City.

Drake Well Museum's PHMC staff also experienced changes with the retirement of Maintenance Repairman Jerry Dowling in September 2022 and the departure of Clerical Assistant Heather McFadden later that December. Jerry was replaced by Tom Lindsay in March 2023; maintenance also hired Larry Moore in June as the seasonal Semi-Skilled Laborer. Site Administrator Michael Knecht began working full time at Drake Well in April 2023. The month of May was bittersweet as we said goodbye to longtime Curator Susan Beates who retired after serving Drake Well and its collections for 25 years.

Friends of Drake Well continues to have success in finding student interns to help with education, interpretation, and collections. Denali John and Mackenzie Hill both served as interns under Friends of Drake Well during the summer of 2022. FDW hired Abigail Vinson and John Hetrick as student interns for summer of 2023 while PHMC hired Keystone Intern, Sonya Kokus, to help specifically with collections. All five students were outstanding in their work and a huge help to both Drake Well and Historic Pithole City!

Staffing was tight at times during 2022-23, but we are pleased to announce the recent hiring of Mark Entwistle as the new FDW Bookkeeper (August 2023) and Sarah Bell as the new Curator for Drake Well Museum (November 2023). PHMC is also looking to fill the Clerical Assistant position within the next few months, which means that by spring 2023 Drake Well Museum will be fully staffed!





FACILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

- Densmore Tank Car tanks were restored and installed on the flatbed rail car. The exhibit was moved to a new location along Oil Creek within Drake Well Museum and Park.
- Two pavilions were built one for over the Densmore Tank Car exhibit and another for over the firewood used in the Drake Well Replica.
- A temporary exhibit, PA Oil Racing into the 21st Century opened in the Museum's Multi-Purpose Room during Pennsylvania's Birthday on March 12, 2023.
- Significant infrastructure work was accomplished for the pedestrian bridge over the mill race, the relocation of the Grant Well Office, and the creation of the new Blacksmith Shop/Cooper Shop exhibit.
